We are in the season of Advent. By God's grace and infinite mercy, the joyous season of Christmas is with us. A season of celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus' entrance into human history is an occasion of great remembrance and jubilation. His birth is the greatest news ever that God visited our planet. God came in human flesh when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Luke 2:11 indicates that this priceless gift of the savior was announced by the angels to shepherds watching over their flocks by night.

Knitting and Crocheting is meeting weekly:







John "Mike" Wilson '89 Distinguished Alumni Award

Mike Wilson is a Grammy Award winning audio engineer and the coowner of Patchwerk Recording Studios in Atlanta, GA. Mr. Wilson graduated from Old Dominion University with a Bachelor of Science in business administration and Music Business Institute with a degree in music entertainment management.

He has engineered multiple Billboard Chart topping songs, major television and film projects and worked with hundreds of artists including TLC, Beyoncé, Sting, Stevie Wonder, John Legend and the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Mike has received 13 Grammy nominations and two Grammy wins, including Album of the Year (2003) and Record of the Year (2010). He has received two Visionary Awards and a

GMA Dove Award nomination and is an active member of The Recording Academy. He was a music stage manager for the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games closing ceremonies. He has engineered over 80 Gold and Platinum records throughout his career.

He is an accomplished guitarist, having played guitar in several rock bands and as a session guitarist on major label albums. He continues to perform with *A Theory of Now* with whom he released the album "Peace in Time." He co-wrote and performed the theme song for the "Joe Ray Bonding Show," a CBS television series.

He is actively involved in humanitarian and community improvement efforts including "Holiday Lights of Hope" for the benefit of abused children and "I Do Music" for up-and-coming artists who might not otherwise have an opportunity to follow their dreams.
